We are a community-based organization dedicated to providing support to women in transition from prison back to communities in Southern New Hampshire.

Volunteers have had training concerning the realities faced by women who have spent time in prison. We will engage in ongoing training in order to be as sensitive and helpful as possible. We respect your privacy and will maintain confidentiality.

Our goal is to help women returning to the community become self-empowered and self-supporting.

## We Are Here for You

Upon your release, we are available to transport you from prison to your destination in Southern New Hampshire. We will also provide you with some basic toiletries, clothing, and a resource guide to local area services.

## Transportation

We offer transportation to women transitioning back to their communities for the following purposes:

- Meetings with parole officers
- Medical appointments
- Support meetings
- Shopping for essentials
- Meals at soup kitchens and community suppers
- Other necessary events
